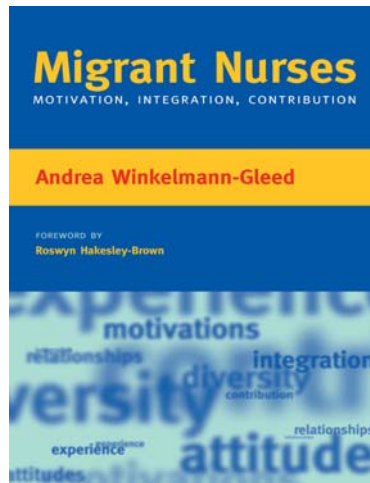

DIRECTIONS TO THE WOMEN'S LIBRARY

Buses

The following buses stop very near Old Castle Street on Whitechapel High Street, or at Aldgate bus station: 15, 25, 40, 42, 67, 78, 100, 115, 253

Bicycles

There are racks outside Calcutta House. Bicycles are left at the owner's risk.

Tubes and Trains

Aldgate East Tube station

Hammersmith and City and District lines

3 minute walk

On the platform take the Toynbee Hall exit. Turn right out of the station, and take the first turning on your right, Old Castle Street. The Women's Library is a large brick building half way down the street on your left.

Aldgate Tube station

Metropolitan and Circle lines

5 minute walk

Turn left out of the station and use the underpass to cross Middlesex Street. Continue straight on as you exit from the underpass into Whitechapel High Street. Old Castle Street is the second turning on your left.

Liverpool Street station

Local and mainline rail, Central, Circle, Hammersmith and City, and Metropolitan lines

10 minute walk

Use the escalators to exit into Bishopsgate. Cross the road and turn left. Take the first right, into Middlesex Street, walk down, and turn left into Wentworth Street. Old Castle Street is the second turning on the right.

Parking

Visitors are advised to avoid travelling by car to The Women's Library, where possible. We are just inside the central London congestion zone; for more details visit www.cclondon.com We have one car parking space for disabled parking permit holders which should be booked in advance, and there are also three disabled parking bays in Old Castle Street.
